I will be starting up a new session on Tuesday, September 13th. I. FALL QUARTER THEME & PERFORMANCES

The Guitar Orchestra is an unusual venture and I believe that in the coming months we could bring a lot of joy to some that may not be expecting it. Some of this will involve daytime performances and if you all can't make it, I can make adjustments.

II. MUSIC

I have chosen some very beautiful pieces, that focus on a light and beautiful sound. These are; the Pastoral from the Archangelo Corelli's Christmas Concerto. The gorgeous Nimrod from the Enigma Variations by Edward Elgar, Nata Lux Lumine by the English renaissance composer Thomas Tallis. We, here in Seattle, and in the Guitar Orchestra, also have a new project in establishing a relationship with a sister city in Isfahan, Iran with the composer Ashkan Saberi. He has written a piece for us! I can send the music to you as soon as you tell me you are in.
